

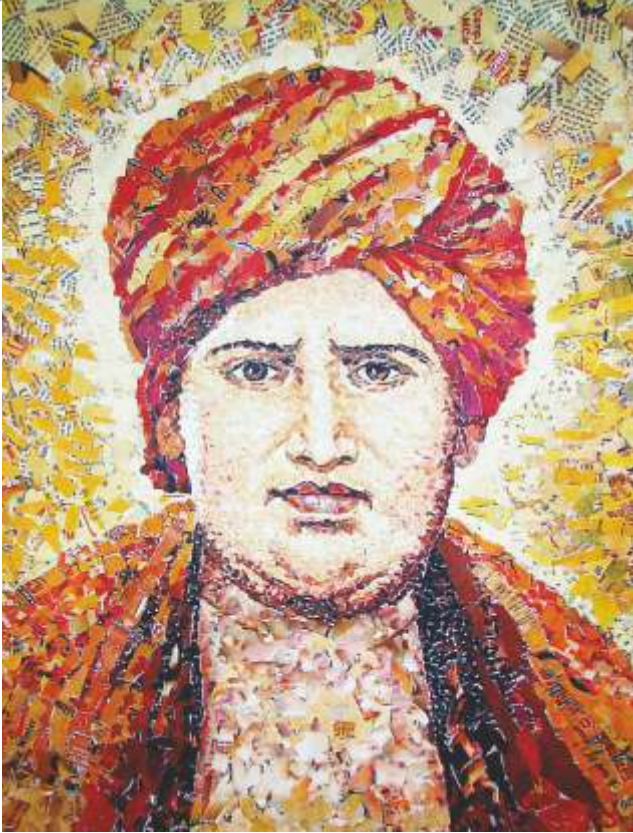

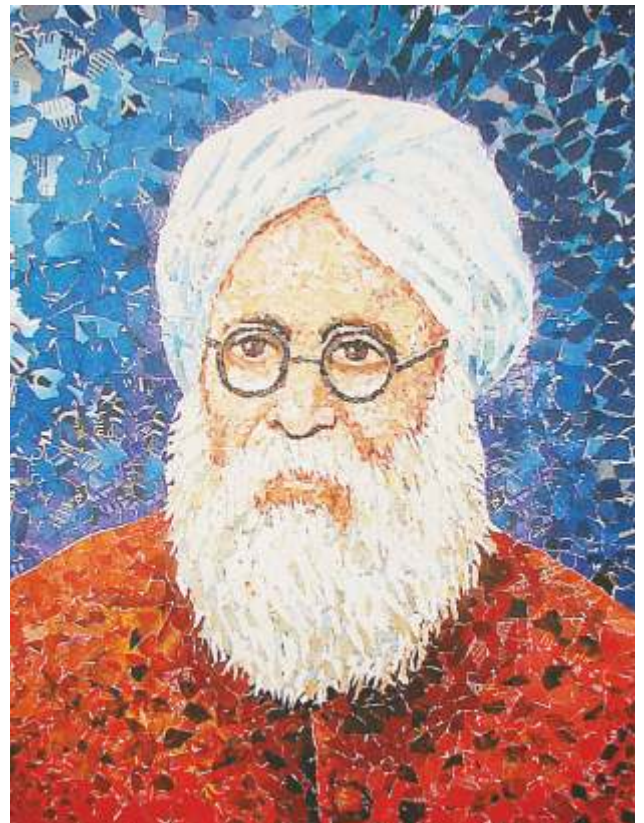
THE DAV MOVEMENT : A HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE



Centuries of domination had degenerated the once great Indian society and culture into an abyss of ignorance, sloth and inertia by the time **Swami Dayanand Saraswati** (1824-1883) arrived to regenerate and reconstruct. The whole of India was suffering from a cultural crisis. People had drifted from their cultural moorings and were lost in a no man's land—neither here nor there. The rich Indian culture and heritage had lost its luster and aping the West blindly had become a fashion statement; it carried prestige and position in society. Swami Dayanand Saraswati realised that the once lively and pulsating Indian society had gone into deep slumber and that the pressing need of the hour was to wake it up, to reactivate and rejuvenate it. Possessed of sharp intellect and a vision far ahead of his times, he realised that the salvation lay in educating our people by propagating the real message of the Vedas. He knew that not just knowledge but wisdom and reason can distinguish man from an animal. He ceaselessly worked to induct a new life in his people through religious reformation, social reconstruction, cultural regeneration

and political emancipation. He urged people to shun dogmas and adopt scientific outlook. He led them towards a new kind of awakening – based on wisdom, reason, and science. He was the first Indian who realized the importance of education for the well-being of society.

The philosophy of Swami Dayanand Saraswati was translated into reality by Lala Hans Raj, later known as **Mahatma Hansraj** (1864-1938) and his selfless and dedicated associates, the founding fathers of the D.A.V. Movement. Frail of body but possessing heroic spirits, Mahatma Hans Raj voluntarily opted for a life of self denial and renunciation. He started a school in Lahore on 1 June 1886 and devoted his whole life to this school. He named the school as D.A.V. School, that is Dayanand Anglo-Vedic School. The movement spread gradually and with the passage of time a large number of D.A.V. Institutions came into existence. But the partition of the country in 1947 left more than half the D.A.V. Institutions in Pakistan. Rehabilitation of the institutions and displaced employees and students was a herculean task but the challenge was met effectively by the stalwarts of the D.A.V. Movement like Lala Lajpat Rai, Bhai Parmanand, Lala Dwarka Das, Principal Sen Das, Bakshi Ram Ratan and Bakshi Tek Chand. They were the ones who put life back into it and rehabilitated the organisation.



THE DAY ORGANISATION



The executive body of D.A.V. College Trust and Managing Society is established in New Delhi. It is the largest non-government educational organization with more than 900 educational institutions, colleges, professional and technical institutions, management institutions, Vedic education and research institutions, aided and Public schools. The D.A.V. is more than just an institution or an organization. It is a way of life that crosses all barriers of caste, creed, race or religion. D.A.V. believes that it is only in education where lies the greatest service to the individual, to the nation and to humanity.

THE MISSION

The D.A.V. vision of education is in keeping with the National Policy on Education (1986) and in accordance with New Education Policy. It lays great emphasis on developing a national system of education with Education for all; eliminating disparities in educational system, providing more facilities through qualitative intervention, empowering women, providing education to disadvantaged sections of the society. THE SCHOOL : A BRIEF BACKGROUND

D.A.V. Public School, Kurukshetra came into existence in a rented Kothi in Sector-13, Urban Estate on 25 January 1987. The admission process for the first session began on 01 February 1987. The school was, however, formally inaugurated on 09 August 1987. In the first year the school had classes from Nursery to VI, students' strength of 184 and 8 well-qualified, experienced and dedicated teachers. Over the years, the school has risen to phenomenal heights.



The campus is aesthetically landscaped providing ideal environment for studies. The school takes pride in the fact that it has the most beautiful and the most modern building of the town, comparable to the best of Haryana.



Students are provided a neat, clean, hygienic and serene environment for studies. The lush green lawns with flowers all around fill the heart with pleasure. Well-planned and aesthetic landscape is the hallmark of this school.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ❖ Admission Schedule for fresh admissions is notified through print media/social media as well as through the school website.
- ❖ Parents are advised to go through all the rules and regulations given in the Handbook of Information/School Diary, as well as on the website before applying for admission.
- ❖ The Admission Schedule is supposed to be followed strictly. This also applies to old students seeking admission to the next class.
- ❖ A child must complete the age of 3 years for admission to Nursery as on 31 March of the admission year.
- ❖ Admission in Nursery is given after interaction with parent and child.
- ❖ Admission in Class K.G. onwards depends on the availability of seats or vacant seats announced. Parents are requested to submit request letter for admission or getting the name registered. After entrance/interaction, list of selected candidates is displayed on a specified date. Prospectus is issued to the selected candidates only.
- ❖ At the time of admission Copy of Date of birth Certificate, Aadhar Card, SRN, School leaving Certificate of previous school, Report Card of Previous class and two photographs are to be submitted.
- ❖ Photocopies of the above mentioned documents are to be attached with the admission form after proper verification by the admission committee.
- ❖ Required fee is to be deposited as per schedule announced, failing which the seat is treated as vacant and is offered to the next candidate.
- ❖ Seats are reserved for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) as per norms.
- ❖ The Principal reserves the right to deny admission to any candidate without assigning any reason whatsoever.
- ❖ The admission stands automatically cancelled if the admission dues are not paid by the last date and time as given in the Admission Schedule. This applies to old students also.
- ❖ Fee once paid is non-refundable.
- ❖ Parents apply for School Leaving Certificate on the basis of their transfer. Such request should be submitted in writing before 31 March and should also be supported with a copy of transfer orders.
- ❖ The admission is provisional and can be cancelled any time during the session on any of the following grounds:
 - ✧ Serious acts of indiscipline/indulgence in any unlawful activity
 - ✧ Misbehaviour with fellow students or teachers
 - ✧ Regular default in payment of school dues
 - ✧ Submission of wrong or misleading facts/fake certificates at the time of admission
 - ✧ Cheating in examinations
 - ✧ Violation of rules and regulations of the school

RULES & REGULATIONS

FEE REGULATIONS

- ❖ **School Fees and other charges are announced before the commencement of the Academic Session.**
- ❖ The fee is to be paid quarterly as per the schedule given below :

- ❖ All the dues are to be deposited by the 15th of the payable months.
- ❖ After due date i.e. 15th, fine @ Rs20/- per day will be charged till 20th of the payable month.
- ❖ After 20th to last day of due month fine @Rs.50/- will be charged.
- ❖ After end of the month the name of the student will be struck off in case of non-payment of fee.
- ❖ If the parents wish to seek re-admission of their ward, the same will depend on the availability of seat and at the sole discretion of school management. If the admission is allowed the child will be treated as new admission and supposed to pay the New Admission Fee along with due charges.
- ❖ Issue of Report Card, School Leaving Certificate and Promotion of the student to the next class are subject to clearance of all dues.

LIBRARY RULES

- ❖ Library facility is available to all the students according to class time table.
- ❖ A book shall be issued for a maximum period of seven days. After that a fine of Rs. 10/- per day per book shall be charged.
- ❖ Reference books cannot be issued.
- ❖ In case of loss or damage of a book, the borrower shall have to either replace the book or pay double the price of the book.
- ❖ No school bag/carry bags/ eatable items are allowed in the library.
- ❖ Wearing ID card is mandatory and no book will be issued without ID card.
- ❖ Students are advised not to get book issued to their friends on their ID Cards.
- ❖ Any kind of indiscipline in school library will be considered punishable.

TRANSPORT RULES

A. SCHOOL TRANSPORT

1. Transport facility is available on existing routes only.
2. Students must reach their bus stoppages in time. School bus will not wait for any reason.
3. In case a student misses his bus in the morning or the afternoon, parents will have to drop or pick the student, themselves.
4. The student using school transport has to carry his/her ID card indicating Bus Pass which can be checked any time.
5. Students will be enrolled for transport facility in the beginning of session only.
6. Transport facility will not be provided/ withdrawn in the mid of the session.

B. OWN VEHICLE

1. Those who come to school by their own vehicle have to submit a photocopy of their driving licence in the school office at the time of admission.
2. The school is not responsible for the safety of students outside the school who come to school on their own vehicle or by a hired rickshaw / auto-rickshaw.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. Bringing of mobile phones in the school premises is strictly prohibited. Jewellery, cash and costly items are not allowed to be brought in school by the students.
2. Any kind of damage done to school property by any student is a punishable offence and it is to be compensated by him or her.
3. Disobedience or any misconduct affecting the discipline of the school is dealt with seriously.
4. All students are expected to reach school before the school bell rings.
5. A Disciplinary action will be taken if the children are repeatedly coming late to school. Parents' co-operation is solicited in maintaining punctuality, regularity and discipline.
6. Lending or borrowing of money or any other articles is strictly prohibited.
7. Students should observe polite behavior .Shouting bullying or use of foul language is forbidden.
8. Every student is expected to maintain an attendance record of at least 75% during the academic year, failing which he or she may not be allowed to take the examination.
9. The identity card must be worn by the students everyday.
10. Special fine will be imposed for being absent without prior permission on special occasions or during the period important from learning point of view.
